

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CORONAVIRUS SOUTH WEST BUSINESS PROPERTY UPDATE

Landlords and Tenants Working Together in Business Lockdown

Since the business implications of Coronavirus struck we have had many, many conversations with clients and business colleagues about how to manage this sudden change in circumstances. Whether they are landlords or tenants, they are in unchartered waters.

Tenants are wondering if they should pay their rent and service charges with the media exclusively reporting cases where withholding payment appears to be commonplace, not realising that the majority of tenants are paying as normal. Landlords are trying to work out how to help keep tenants in business whilst honouring their own commitments to pay staff, to pay interest and to maintain the viability of their own businesses. Particularly in areas like Somerset, it is not uncommon for landlords to have just one or two properties and rely on the rent for their living income, often in retirement.

As we see in so many ways, this crisis has brought out the good in society, but also exposed the less attractive side of some. In our business we have seen landlords immediately offer tenants in the charitable sector a period of rent suspension so that they can continue offering valuable services needed more now than ever. In others, we have seen tenants jump on the bandwagon, just refusing to pay rent because they have heard that it is happening. There can't be many businesses not affected by this pandemic but some are in those business sectors where products and services are suddenly in high demand and there is no reason to delay rental payments.

There is not a right or wrong outcome for all cases but one thing is clear, landlords and tenants should talk and keep in touch. Tenants need to understand that any rent not paid for now will still need to be paid in the future and most leases provide for interest to be charged. Working constructively with your landlord now, may influence future discussions when the fall-out from Coronavirus is being cleared up. On the other hand, landlords that expect the impossible from tenants will end up with empty buildings – the ones that we regularly work with are already 'tenant focussed' and this ethos will stand them in good stead now, more than ever.

Here are our 'Six of the Best' tips for landlords and tenants:

- Talk first.
- Tenants, pay what you can now, based on what is happening to your business.
- If the tenant has taken a hit in cash flow, carefully agree and record a payment timetable, dealing with interest and when it may be charged and when not.
- Landlords should look at how costs can be reduced if properties are not being used in the normal way, for example, in service charges for multi-occupied buildings.
- Landlords, be flexible about innovative ideas if tenants wish to temporarily change the use of buildings to help the business stay afloat.
- Keep talking.

And one for luck – seek advice from your commercial property advisor.

For the Mango Tree, "Feeling Good and Doing Good" isn't just about the ethos around veganism, it's also based on supporting local initiatives and charitable causes. The Mango Tree have made links to the Taunton Urban Gardening Project – the restaurant are buying mushrooms grown on the land, situated to the rear of North Street Church, and the project will also be helping Prem and the team plant up containers for the growth of their own herbs and spices once the warmer weather returns. Surplus food from the restaurant is supplied to ARC at Linley House, as the organisation strive for local homeless people to have a safe and supportive environment.

The Mango Tree can cater for groups of all sizes, and since opening the team have been delighted to welcome large parties and corporate guests, making use of their upstairs dining area. Prem would welcome the opportunity to discuss with you any business entertaining needs, including delivery off site.

SUPPORTING APPRENTICES DURING COVID-19

Matt Tudor, Director of Business Development, Marketing & Digital Innovation at member organisation Bridgwater & Taunton College, details here his thoughts about how we should respond to our amazing apprentices through this difficult time whilst protecting ours and their future.

"In all my 23 years in education – including teacher training, where the art of reflective practice was first embedded, the COVID-19 (CV-19) pandemic must surely rank as the most reflective period of all. This is no doubt mainly due to the considerable reduction in physical 'busyness' (my commute to work is now three strides long), and in its place I find myself thinking about the challenges CV-19 is presenting to today's young people in particular.

This is no doubt mainly due to the considerable reduction in physical 'busyness' (my commute to work is now three strides long), and in its place I find myself thinking about the challenges CV-19 is presenting to today's young people in particular.

The impact of the lockdown on GCSE and A-Level results has been widely reported, but other age groups are suffering as well – for example, younger children who are leaving primary school this year and have had little or no opportunity to celebrate and say farewell to six happy years. And what about the nation's apprentices - at Bridgwater & Taunton College we have almost 3,000 apprentices working across numerous industry sectors, in roles that vary from water workers with the Environment Agency and project controllers at Hinkley Point C, to healthcare workers on the frontline of the fight again COVID-19.

What Upheavals are they undergoing? For many years an apprenticeship has presented young people with an opportunity to enter the workplace earlier than their peers; also, we are also now seeing young people of exceptional talent choosing an apprenticeship over the more traditional routes to academic success. While still wanting to further their career with advanced qualifications, they're choosing to be an employee first and foremost.

However, as CV-19 sees businesses struggling, apprentices are facing employment challenges previously unseen – for example, before last

month who had even heard of the word 'furlough', and yet the British Chamber of Commerce now states that 'over 9 million UK employees are expected to be on furlough by the end of April', costing the UK economy £30 – 40bn.

It's easy to look at an apprentice and - in simple terms - view their contribution as less valuable because they're in training and unqualified. It is much harder to see them as the talent of the future, yet this is what they are, and a failure to protect them now risks leading to an entire generation's gap in workforce talent.

What can we hear you do? I hear you ask The message is simple - communicate, communicate, communicate! My super talented Business Development team are contacting employers all day, every day, signposting the multiple support channels open to them, and highlighting the fact that if they need to furlough an apprentice, the apprentices can continue to learn as long as they are paid the national minimum wage. On the flip side, a number of the businesses we work with are on the frontline and so incredibly busy that they have to deploy apprentices away from their usual role. This is still learning, it is still the capture of new skills and behaviours, so there's no need to pause their apprenticeship.

I was recently privileged to hear Jonah Stillman talk about the so-called Gen Z at work. He clearly articulates that if a business is to be successful in harnessing the skills of Gen Z, then it must quickly understand their needs and respond. An integral part of this accordingly is understanding that they are digital natives who desire to belong, crave diversity and are 'WeConomists' who believe in a shared economy.

So, bosses and company owners, please nurture your talent now in this time of crisis - because if you don't do right by them, you can't be surprised in the future if they choose to work elsewhere.

Bridgwater & Taunton College's residential accommodation in Trull opened at the beginning of April to offer people three meals a day and support.

The College, along with homeless charity Arc, YMCA Dulverton Group, Somerset West and Taunton Council and a range of other organisations, worked together to ensure that the project provides shelter and help the homeless tenants to self isolate and social distance, something which their lifestyle makes difficult. This project is one of many that the College is doing in order to play its part in tackling the Coronavirus crisis. Such as, offering free car parking for all NHS staff at their Taunton campus, providing childcare for children of key workers and vulnerable students at the Nursery and supplying the NHS with vital PPE.

BTC Creative Arts Learning Support Coordinator and Technician, Hannah has been working with a local group coordinating scrub production for the Taunton and surrounding Somerset area. Together with other volunteers, she is organising the sourcing of materials, providing patterns and coordinating delivery. The College Creative Arts department are rallying a team of staff to get involved too and already domestic machines are being given to staff so they can start making scrubs, and potentially masks for community use, from home! The University Somerset team have also been putting the University 3D printers to good use by producing head visors, with protective screens, for keyworkers at Musgrove Park Hospital - producing over 30 visors daily, these are being supplied to the NHS alongside those being made at next door neighbours, The Castle School.


CULLENS RISE TO THE CORONAVIRUS CHALLENGE:


